Successful federalism and decentralisation require strong actors on the sub-national level. Subnational governments fulfil a key role in service delivery, integration and conflict resolution. They are decisive actors for sustainable development.

The Practitioner's Course on Subnational Governance is designed to support sub-national actors in accomplishing their challenging tasks in demanding contexts, often exposed to scarcity, diversity and conflict. It is intended for officials and professionals working in administrations or parliaments of provinces, states or regions in multilevel settings. The two-week programme, taking place in Fribourg, Switzerland, combines theoretical inputs with practical studies and peer-to-peer learning and offers the unique opportunity to deepen the participants' understandings on issues related to federalism, decentralisation and multilevel governments.

The participants will share their experiences, work on a personal project during the course and report on transfers of new insights to their professional activities.
