It is a pleasure to invite you to the 2016 Global Forum on Modern Direct Democracy. The conference is organized by Arizona State University; the Initiative & Referendum Institute Europe, which is affiliated with the University of Wuppertal's Institute for Democracy and Participation Research; and the city of Donostia-San Sebastian, Spain, which is also hosting the event at its Miramar Palace on November 16-19.

Among the forum's hosting partners are the Council of Europe, International IDEA, Democracy International and Swissinfo, the international service of the Swiss Broadcasting Company.

The forum's theme will be: "Local Participation, Global Coexistence." The forum calls for papers and presentations that look at any aspect of modern direct and participatory democracy around the world.
